It ensures your team remains connected, informed, and trusted within the auctioneering and valuation professions.

Membership aligns with the calendar year (renewals are due each 1 January). For applications received during the year, the membership fee is pro-rated, except for memberships approved between October and December, where the membership fee is applied through to the end of the following year. All new members are required to pay a one-off application fee plus the membership fee (if approved).

The application fee is non-refundable and reflects the administrative processes involved in assessing membership applications. This helps ensure fairness, consistency, and the integrity of AVAA's membership framework.

Annual renewal of AVAA Corporate Membership requires proof of current professional indemnity insurance. Corporate members undertaking auctions must also provide a valid Trust Account Audit Certificate, ensuring compliance with professional standards and reinforcing accountability across the industry.

The AVAA Board sets membership fees and are subject to periodic review, with adjustments made at the Board's discretion and without prior notice.
